

We have been hard at work putting the final touches on the Hospitality House. The granite counter tops were installed on June 21st. This allowed us to finally complete the kitchen.



HOSPITALITY HOUSE UPDATE - continued

Since David's double lung transplant he has been in the ICU for 54 days. David has gone into kidney failure and is starting dialysis. A week ago he had surgery on his diaphragm because it wasn't working properly. The surgery was not successful because his diaphragm was paralyzed. In an upcoming surgery, they will be inserting a GI tube for feeding so they can put him on a Bipap machine as they wean him off the ventilator. In the upcoming weeks, David will be moved to a longer-term care facility. His recovery is going to be a long road.

The family is going stir crazy in the hotel. The kids are getting more edgy and fighting more than usual. It is difficult to constrain the pent up energy when there is not much to do. Missy (15) who has epilepsy had a particularly difficult week with more frequent seizures. The hotel is being renovated and the family will have to move to a different floor for the second time.

Prayer Requests:

- Thank the Lord for his providence and care for David and his family in this trying situation.
- Thank the Lord for the volunteers and donors who have stepped up to support Faith Congregation in this new ministry as they prepare the house to serve this family and others in the future.
- Thank the Lord for helping us to overcome the obstacles that have slowed things down.
- Pray for guidance of the doctors and medical team who are caring for David.
- Pray that according to the Lord's will David's diaphragm starts to work again and is healed.
- Pray that the upcoming medical procedures and the move to the longer term care facility go smoothly and are successful.

- Pray that through all this God draws David, Paige and the family closer to him and strengthens them, filling them with peace and joy as they lean on and trust Jesus through all this.
- Pray for calm and peace for the children.
- Pray for Calm of the stress that causes problems sleeping, leading to anxiety or depression, changes in moods all of which triggers more seizures.
- Pray for Paige and her daughter Brooklyn giving them peace and comfort as they care for the children.
- Pray that the Lord removes the barriers as we finish the work on the house and we can get the occupancy permit for the family to move into the house. The 28th of June the family will have been living in the hotel for 3 months.
- Pray that the Lord provides the financial resources to cover the cost of the hotel stay for the family. It costs \$200 a night and we have at least 15 more nights if we can move the family into the house by June 29th.

The family also has an ongoing need for transportation for Paige. If you could drive to Chicago or help with local trips (shopping & appointments), or if you would like to donate or support this mission, please reach out to Gia Winkler.
